States Quarter Program

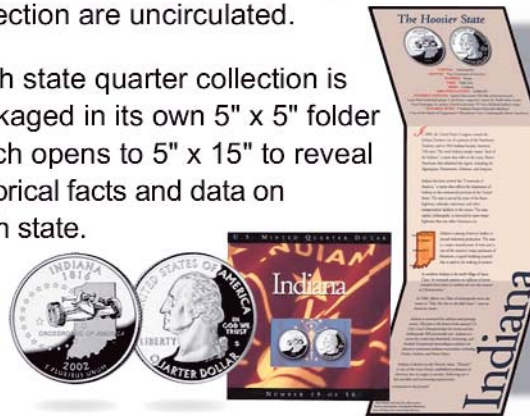
The popular States Quarter Program began in 1999 with the last five quarters issued in 2008. Each quarter set includes a folder with two uncirculated coins and historical information about each state. Based on availability, you may purchase quarter sets, as well as other coin and jewelry items, from a teller at any Interra office. The quarter set collector box, shown on the front cover is also available.

A unique collectors item

Each state quarter collection includes two quarters: one has a Denver (D) mint mark and the other Philadelphia (P).

These are the only two U.S. mints that produce for circulation. Both quarters in the collection are uncirculated.

Each state quarter collection is packaged in its own 5" x 5" folder which opens to 5" x 15" to reveal historical facts and data on each state.
