His professional career has been influenced by early involvement in sports, 4-H, and student organizations, which taught him the value of teamwork, accountability, and culture. He credits his success to the guidance of exceptional mentors, parents, coaches, and educators who instilled in him a strong work ethic and commitment to service.

Now serving as Chief Commercial Officer, Blosser says he is most excited to continue building on Interra's legacy and values. "Interra was founded by local farmers who came together to help one another," he said. "That spirit still guides us today.
